- September 8th: Saturn will be at its brightest and closest to Earth, making it a great time for viewing its rings.
- September 17th: A supermoon Harvest Moon will occur.
- September 22nd: The start of autumn in the Northern Hemisphere.
- Pleiades: This star cluster will be visible in the evening sky, it can be spotted with a telescope or binoculars.
- INSS (International Space Station)- On a clear night, viewers can see the INSS pass over. For precise times and dates, visit unearth.space.
