Celebrating the Holidays with Tradition and Sweet Treats

As the holiday season arrives, delightful aromas fill the home while a feast is being prepared. Family recipes evoke a sense of nostalgia for everyone gathered around the table. While many families prepare a three or four-course meal, the dessert served at the end adds a sweet finish to the savory feast. What dessert is served at your gathering? Does your family enjoy pie for Thanksgiving?

Pumpkin, pecan, and apple pies, with or without ice cream, are sure to please those with full bellies. However, pies also have a rich history.

According to author Max Miller, who penned the cookbook *Tasting History*, the first pecan orchard was planted in 1772 on Long Island, New York. Early orchards faced challenges with inconsistent flavors; one tree would produce sweet nuts while its neighbor yielded bitter ones. The solution, grafting, proved difficult and often unsuccessful. Eventually, in 1846, an enslaved gardener named Antoine in Louisiana successfully grafted around 116 trees. By 1876, the nuts from these trees won the Best Pecan award at the Philadelphia Centennial Exposition. Today, these nuts are known as the Centennial Pecan and are the most widely produced nuts.

Cookbooks became filled with pecan recipes, including the beloved pecan pie. Before the introduction of Karo syrup, the original pecan pie featured a more custard-like base. By the 1930s, this dessert had secured its place on Thanksgiving tables and has remained a cherished staple ever since.

The library is seeking a volunteer to host this adult book club. The two requirements are host meeting once a month for three months and set a timer for one hour.


The library will provide the space, advertisement, and books as needed. Coffee and water will be provided for attendees. Interested in leading this fun book club? Speak with the librarian!
